



Thammasat University Notification
on
Measures and Recommendations on the Prevention and Control of Coronavirus
(COVID-19) (NO. 21)

Pursuant to Thammasat University Notification on Measures and Recommendations on the Prevention and Control of Coronavirus (COVID-19) No. 20, upon monitoring the current situation of the spread, and following the announcement of the Center for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) on 7 April 2021, it is evident that the number of infected cases have continued to rise in several provinces of Thailand, such as Bangkok, Samut Sakorn, and Pathum Thani. With concern for the health, and for the purpose of prevention and risk reduction of infection among university personnel and students having to travel, to work, or to participate in a variety of activities,

To respond to these incidents, Thammasat University hereby issues the following measures:

1. Faculty members, university staff and students shall refrain from unnecessary travel to the risk areas of COVID-19, congested communities or crowded areas. If unavoidable, they must undertake precautionary measures and strictly comply with public health measures.
2. Faculty members, university staff and students with symptoms suspicious of COVID-19, or having had exposure to Covid-19 patients, must consistently observe their symptoms and complete the risk assessment forms of Thammasat University Hospital. Individuals evaluated as having a high risk will be contacted by the hospital for a further medical test. For any inquiries, notification or consultation about the disease, please contact the Student Health Center, Students Affairs Division, 1st floor, SC Building, Thammasat University, Rangsit Center, Tel 02-696-6600 - 2.
3. The Deans/Directors or Vice Rectors in charge shall consider the implementation of a work-from-home policy, the overlapping of working hours, and the control of the number of staff working in the same areas while maintaining efficiency, preventing any impacts on work and strictly complying with public health measures.

4. Classes, teaching, examinations, meetings, seminars and activities will be conducted online. If the online format is not feasible, the responsible heads shall exercise their discretion as deemed appropriate while strictly complying with public health and hygiene measures. Such actions must be reported to the university for acknowledgement.
