



Thammasat University Notification
on
Measures and Recommendations on the Prevention and Control of Coronavirus
(COVID-19) (No. 14)

Pursuant to Thammasat University Notifications on Measures and Recommendations on the Prevention and Control of Coronavirus (COVID-19), upon monitoring the situation on the spread of COVID-19, on December 19 the Center for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) announced the finding of 548 new patients in Samut Sakhon Province, most of whom were asymptomatic, and requested Samut Sakhon residents to refrain from traveling outside the province, while designating it as a maximum control area. The said area being in close proximity to Bangkok and, by extension, Pathum Thani, with concern for the health of faculty, staff, and students having to travel to work or to participate in educational activities,

Thammasat University hereby issues the following measures:


1. Faculty, staff, and students shall avoid unnecessary travel to COVID-19 risk areas or to congested communities, and shall closely follow updates from the government and the university.
2. Faculty, staff, and students residing in the mentioned area or have travelled to Samut Sakhon from 1 December 2020 shall be considered by the Dean/Director or Vice Rector in charge for a 14-day self-quarantine starting from the day of their return. The days of self-quarantine shall not be considered days of absence from work nor leave. The mentioned persons shall observe the following steps:
 - 2.1 Complete the COVID-19 Surveillance Form via the TU COVID-19 Line.
 - 2.2 Measure body temperature twice daily (morning-evening) for 14 days from the day of return from Samut Sakhon and report this information by completing the Daily Monitoring Form for Thammasat University Students and Personnel via the TU COVID-19 Line.
 - 2.3 Regularly observe symptoms and immediately seek medical treatment from a medical facility if experiencing a fever or cough, runny nose, sore throat, loss of smell, loss of taste, or fast breathing.
 - 2.4 All personnel shall strictly comply with public health and hygiene measures, wear medical or cloth masks, regularly wash their hands, observe social distancing, avoid crowded places, public transportation, and eschew using shared items.
3. Students residing in or have travelled to Samut Sakhon, having to take the 1/2020 final exam or to fulfil assignments, conduct experiments or other activities related to academic assessment at the university shall inform the course lecturer or the student affairs office at the Faculty/College/Institute to acknowledge and determine

appropriate assessment methods, strictly taking into account public health and hygiene measures.

4. The Dean/Director or Vice Rector in charge shall consider assigning Work from Home, staggered office times appropriately, and limiting the number of staff at office, while maintaining efficiency and preventing any impact on work and strictly taking into account public health and hygiene measures.
5. There shall be screening and temperature check points before entry into buildings on campus and at offices. Hand disinfectants or alcohol gel shall be sufficiently provided and persons entering university areas shall wear face masks. Outsiders or persons with no business shall not be admitted to the university compounds.
