



Thammasat University Notification  
on  
Guidelines for Semester 2/2020 Classes during the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Situation

---

Pursuant to the new wave of Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak having broadly expanded to many areas and daily increases in confirmed domestic infection cases, the government issued the Regulation under Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situations B.E. 2558 (No. 16), whereby regulation number 1 stipulates the closure of buildings and venues of all educational institute located in maximum control areas. Accordingly, it is prohibited for conducting classes, examinations, trainings or other activities involving the participation of many people, except for remote or online classes/ activities, or to provide assistance to persons. In accordance with the University Executive Committee decision made at the 1/2021 meeting, held on 4 January 2021,

Thammasat University hereby issues the guidelines for semester 2/20 classes as follows:

1. In Semester 2/2020, class schedules, midterm, and final examination schedules, and semester closing dates shall be according to the original academic calendar notified by the Registrar's Office.

2. In semester 2/2020, classes shall be conducted online until further notice. For practicum courses involving student training within university premises, online demonstrations or other teaching formats not creating risks or burdens to the students shall be used.

Requests to hold practicum courses involving student training within university premises or at Thammasat Hospital shall be submitted to the Dean for approval prior to implementation.


3. Student experiments/research activities performed within university premises shall be permitted if necessary. The student shall submit public health measures and the time period for the experiment/research activity to the Dean for approval prior to implementation.

4. Faculty members wishing to use online teaching systems at university venues shall notify the university in advance through their course coordinators.

Faculties or university offices responsible for organizing and managing online classes shall be tasked with preparation and support of online teaching, while limiting the number of users in the area at an appropriate level.

5. When using university areas or Thammasat Hospital for teaching purposes, conducting experiments/lab work or for student practicum, related persons shall strictly comply with relevant laws, regulations, rules and measures of the government and the university
