Guidelines for Classes, Teaching and Examination Arrangements for Summer 2020 Semester and Semester 1/2021 during the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Situation

As a consequence of the new wave of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak that has broadly expanded to many areas with a daily increase in the number of confirmed domestic infected cases, the Thai government issued regulations under Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situations B.E. 2548 (No. 20), whereby regulation number 1 stipulates the prohibition of the use of buildings and venues of all educational institutes for conducting classes, examinations, training or other activities involving the participation of many people, except for being used under laws relating to communicable diseases or used as a patronage venue, or used as a venue as stipulated in regulation number 1 of the Regulation (No 16) issued on 3 January 2021. In accordance with the University Executive Committee decision made at the 9/2021 meeting, held on 24 May 2021, all Thammasat University campuses shall arrange classes and examinations online for the Summer 2020 Semester and Semester 1/2021.

Thammasat University hereby issues the following guidelines for the arrangement of the Summer 2020 Semester and for Semester 1/2021:

- 1. All Thammasat University campuses shall conduct classes and examinations online for the Summer 2020 Semester and Semester 1/2021. The period of study, final examination schedules, and the end of each term shall be in accordance with the original academic calendar previously announced by the Registrar's Office, unless otherwise notified.
- 2. For practicum courses involving student training, the appropriate learning formats that do not create risks of transmitting diseases or place unnecessary burdens on the students and concerned units shall be implemented.
- 3. Access to shared university areas for the purpose of learning, teaching, experiments, or training shall be permitted, if deemed necessary. Submission of the relevant details and public health measures for consideration of approval must be made to the responsible Vice Rector.
- 4. Access to faculty areas or Thammasat University Hospital for teaching purposes, examination arrangements, lab work or for student practicum shall be permitted, if deemed necessary. Submission of the relevant details and public health measures for consideration of approval must be made to the responsible heads of such departments and reported to the University for acknowledgement.

All actions must strictly comply with relevant laws, regulations and measures of the government and the University.
